Black Male Empowerment Cooperative (BMEC) is a project of the <u>CUNY Black Male Initiative (BMI)</u>, whose mission is to increase, encourage and support the inclusion and educational success of students from groups that are severely underrepresented in higher education, in particular African, African-American/Black, Caribbean and Latino/Hispanic males. But we're open to all students.

CREAR Futuros (<u>College Readiness, Achievement and Retention</u>) is an initiative of <u>Hispanic Federation</u> (HF) and CUNY that is specifically focused on actions that support college access, retention and graduation rates for Latino students in New York.
