Founded in 1945, Kansai Gaidai University is strongly committed to international education.




Kansai Gaidai University is a private, non-profit institution comprised of:



Japanese Language Courses

All transfer students are encouraged to take Japanese language courses in order to enrich their experience in Japan. Language courses are offered in both the College of Global Engagement and the Asian Studies Program, and students will be able to take courses appropriate to their level of proficiency from either of these programs. Fees & Expenses Per Year

- Tuition: JPY 800,000
- Education Enhancement Fee: JPY 350,000
- Admission Fee: JPY 250,000 first year only
- Housing: JPY 600,000
- Meals & Miscellaneous: JPY 600,000
- Total: JPY 2,600,000

Scholarships and Financial Assistance

- Scholarships available to qualified students
 - Full tuition
 - Half tuition
- Part-time work opportunities through "Work & Study Program" up to 20 hours per week.

Housing

"Global Commons 結 - YUI -," an on-campus international residence. Half of the residents are local students. Single rooms. Other facilities such as the kitchen, dining room, and bathrooms are shared.





Study Abroad in Asia

Qualified students may participate in KGU's study abroad programs for one semester in Asian countries such as China, Korea, Singapore, Malaysia, and Thailand.









Eligibility

Applicants must meet one of the following criteria:

- ① have graduated or expect to graduate by the end of the month prior to enrolling at CGE from a degree-granting junior college outside of Japan
- 2 have been enrolled for at least two years at degree-granting university outside of Japan and have earned or expect to earn at least 62 credits


